January Board Meeting Summary

The CCA Board met for their regular monthly meeting in January. Here are highlights from the meeting. The meeting was opened with prayer and then devotion by one of the board members. The minutes and treasurer's report were reviewed, discussed, and approved. Old Business discussions included discussion on endowment and marketing plan updates and teacher appreciation sub-committee report. It was also noted that we are continuing to look for individuals in the community that would be willing to come alongside CCA students that need tutoring. New Business – it was noted that the school is working on a dance in the spring for the 7th-10th graders and the music for the dance will have to have good language and not be suggestive. The SLT and the parent events planning committee will have lead on organizing this event.

The administrator's report was presented and it was noted that our enrollment is at 115 students. The CCA letter jacket is now available for purchase at Jim's Sporting Goods and class rings are being reviewed through Glasscock jewelry. Mrs. Townsend did an excellent job with preparing the Christmas programs and the students did an excellent job in their performances at each program. It was noted that the 4th-10th grade concert was dedicated in memory of Mr. Stephenson. The SLT raised \$350 towards The Caroline Wilson benefit. It was noted that CCA collected over 400 boxes of pudding and the 8th-10th graders went and helped in the packaging process. Enrollment roundup will be Friday, February 1 and then we will also have an Open House February 4th-8th.

The board reviewed and discussed evaluations of the faculty and staff and it was noted that Mrs. Ritchie continues evaluating the teachers and has finalized the formal teacher evaluations. The presentation for the reenrollment meeting was discussed and a separate meeting will be set up to review the material to be presented to the parents at that meeting. The board was updated on the athletic sponsorships; the following businesses are supporting CCA athletics with a 2 year commitment – Home Town Realty, Bill Houk Agency, Glasscock Jewelry, Mike Keith Insurance, Poague, Wall Cox, and Adams Attorneys, Hawthorn Bank, Dody Legacy Group, and Walmart. The new Missouri minimum wage act was discussed and its impact on CCA. The Alliance for Choice in Education contacted CCA and it appears that it may be a new scholarship opportunity for those families who are on free and reduced lunch. Some of those families will be able to access this money to help with tuition for the 2019-20 school year. More information will be coming about this tuition assistance opportunity. With Mr. Stephenson's passing, the Friday upper school speech classes were reviewed. Mr. Ballard will be contacting a couple of different individuals this week to finalize an instructor to finish out the school year. The board was updated on the recent teacher in-service on how to handle unwanted intruders at CCA. The board then voted on the finalized strategic plan. The one page final copy of the strategic plan will be presented at the reenrollment meeting on January 29.

The meeting was adjourned after the closing prayer.
