Clinton Christian Academy Board Notes

July 14, 2025

The CCA Board of Directors met in the CCA Art Room for their regular monthly business meeting on Monday, July 14. The meeting began with the opening prayer given by Elroy Schumacher. Barry Bullock led this week's devotion with a thoughtful reflection on the theme of *peace* and its many dimensions in today's world. Drawing from a range of scriptures—including James 1:2, Hebrews 5:8, Psalm 119:67, and Romans 12—he reminded us that peace is not merely the absence of conflict, but a deep, spiritual calling to live with grace, patience, and understanding. Through verses like Matthew 5:10 and James 3:18, we were encouraged to be peacemakers in both our personal lives and broader communities.

The financial reports and bills from the month of June were reviewed and approved. Prayer requests were shared.

- The administration reported that the tentative enrollment for next year is currently at 179.
- Mrs. Ritchie was excited to share that the final section of our playground surfacing is scheduled to be installed in mid-August! This will complete the entire playground area within the fence, creating a safer and more enjoyable space for our students. We're so grateful for the continued blessings and support that have made this improvement possible!
- Mrs. Hyke and Tiffany Thornton updated the Board on the CCA Belize Mission trip that took place June 18–24. Ten team members from CCA participated in a variety of ministry and service activities, including construction work such as painting and repairing a church ceiling, door-to-door outreach, VBS, and hosting special events for women, men, and youth. A slideshow highlighting the team's work and experiences was shared with the Board, offering a meaningful glimpse into the impact of their time in Belize.

BOARD ACTION & DISCUSSION IN JULY

- The Board welcomed Debbie Glascock and David Mills as new members to the CCA Board of Directors! We are so thankful for their willingness to serve.
- Mrs. Hyke presented the MOKAN Athletic Conference updates from the spring and summer meetings: High schools must field a Varsity team before entering a JV team; JV rules will now match JH guidelines. Basketball players are limited to two teams per season and six quarters per day with the exceptions of tournaments. Varsity volleyball will be encouraged to move to a best 3-of-5 format (except tri-matches). Schools are encouraged to use an assigner for officials. A new Work Ethic Award will honor one senior boy and girl annually for character and leadership per school. Coaches will need to select three of the best players from their varsity opponents after each MOKAN varsity game. This process is for selecting MOKAN MVP's and All-conference players.
- The Board approved a Teacher Scholarship Program proposal from ARC Cares, aimed at providing financial support to part-time and full-time teachers with children enrolled at CCA. ARC Cares plans to launch the scholarship for the 2025–26 school year. More details will be shared soon.
