GENERAL INFORMATION

The A+ Scholarship Program is a merit-based scholarship that provides scholarship funds to eligible graduates of A+ designated high schools.

Participation in the A+ program is voluntary and is available to all students in grades 9-12 (unless they have been previously eliminated from participating because of violating the A+ good citizen policy). There is no limit to the number of students in each class who may participate. Students who wish to participate, must enter into a written agreement with their high school prior to graduation.

A+ TUITION REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

Funding for the A+ Scholarship Program is provided by the State of Missouri and is subject to the State budgeting process and the legislative action of the Missouri General Assembly. No local monies will be expended in connection with the A+ Scholarship Program and the expenses incurred by students who elect to participate and who are certified as A+ graduates.

Participants who complete all A+ requirements, who meet all local deadlines and who are certified as A+ graduates of Clinton Christian Academy, are eligible to receive two years (six semesters) of tuition to attend any Missouri public two-year community college or vocational/technical institution.

A+ REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.
- 2. Enter into a written agreement with your high school prior to graduation.
- 3. Attend a designated A+ high school for 2 years prior to graduation.
 - a. 2020 High School Seniors and Forward who attended an A+ designated high school for any 2 years of the 4 years prior to high school graduation have met this requirement.
 - b. In addition, regardless of graduation year, if one of the parents is a member of the military on active duty or has retired from the military and relocated to Missouri within one year of their retirement, the student is exempt from this requirement. However, they must attend an A+

- designated high school in the school year immediately preceding graduation and meet all of the other high school eligibility requirements.
- 4. Graduate from an A+ designated high school with an overall unweighted grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- 5. Have at least a 95% attendance record overall for grades 9-12.
- 6. Perform at least 50 hours of unpaid tutoring or mentoring, of which up to 25% may include job shadowing prior to graduation.
 - a. High school policy may allow this criterion to be met up to 6 months beyond high school graduation in exceptional circumstances.
- 7. Maintain a record of good citizenship and avoid the unlawful use of drugs and/or alcohol while in grades 9-12.
- 8. Perform a minimum total 50 hours of unpaid tutoring.
- 9. Complete, submit and provide proof of submission of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid.
- 10. Register with the selective service in accordance with federal law.
- 11. Meet all local deadlines by submitting all required documentation.
- 12. Have achieved a score of proficient or advanced on the Algebra I end of course exam or a higher level DESE approved end-of-course exam in the field of mathematics.
 - a. **2018 High School Seniors and Forward** If a student meets all of the eligibility requirements for their high school graduating class except the end of course exam requirement, they may establish eligibility by achieving a combined Pre-ACT or ACT math subscore and high school GPA in accordance with the following scale.

Qualifying Scores for ACT Alternative to the A+ Algebra I End-of- Course Exam Requirement Set for 2018 High School Seniors

The following qualifying ACT scores have been approved by the Coordinating Board for Higher Education as an exam alternative to the A+ Algebra I End-of-Course Exam requirement. The CBHE is charged with establishing these minimum scores annually. Students must achieve one of these scores if they do not score proficient or advanced on the Algebra I or a higher-level math end-of-course exam.

ACT Math Score		High School GPA	
17 or greater	and	2.5 or greater	
16	and	2.8 or greater	
15	and	3.0 or greater	

A student may achieve the qualifying score as a high school or postsecondary student. If the student achieves the score as a postsecondary student, they may be eligible for an award in the same term that they take the test provided that they established eligibility before the institution's reimbursement request is submitted.

The scores were set based on an analysis of placement score information from Missouri's community colleges and placement score examples provided by ACT. They are intended to represent real-world college placement practices rather than an equivalency, or concordance, between the scores. The scores are also intended to strike a reasonable balance between the requirement's intent and the reality of diversity in the developmental coursework available at postsecondary institutions. Prior to the CBHE's approval, the scores were vetted with the A+ community, including high school counselors, postsecondary financial aid professionals, community college presidents, and the State Student Financial Assistance Committee. The majority of the feedback received was supportive of the established score levels.

With these alternatives, students now have opportunities with which to meet the A+ Scholarship's college preparedness criterion. Once a student meets one of the following criteria, the student is considered to have met this requirement regardless of previous or subsequent scores received on any of the other options. For example, a student that scores basic on the Algebra I EOC and scores a 17 on the ACT math subtest is eligible based on the ACT score. Students can also retake all of these exams in an effort to achieve a qualifying score.

- 1. Achievement of a score of proficient or advanced on the Algebra I end-of-course exam requirement
- 2. Achievement of a score of proficient or advanced on any DESE-authorized mathematics end-of-course exam that is at a higher level than Algebra I
- 3. Achievement of one of the scores listed above for the ACT math subtest
- 4. Achievement of one of the scores listed above for the ACT math subtest while in college. Students in this category will not be eligible for A+ reimbursement until a qualifying score has been achieved. Until eligibility is established, students can seek assistance to remediate their math deficiencies, including taking developmental coursework at their own expense.

WINDOW OF ACCESS

Certified A+ graduates have up to 48 months from the date of graduation to access the tuition reimbursement benefit.

MAINTAINING THE A+ TUITION BENEFIT IN COLLEGE

To maintain the A+ tuition benefit, a student must be a full-time student (as defined by the college) and working toward the completion of an approved program. Students must maintain a minimum, unrounded, cumulative GPA of 2.500.

A+ ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for the A+ Scholarship, a student must have a 95% overall attendance record beginning with their freshman year. Students are expected to attend school regularly and to be on time for classes. Therefore, the student will acquire the habits of punctuality, self-discipline, and responsibility. A student who does not meet the 95% attendance requirement will not be eligible for the A+ Scholarship. The following attendance guidelines are required of all students participating in the A+ Program:

Students must attend Clinton Christian Academy or another Missouri A+ school for two consecutive years prior to graduation. Early graduation is discouraged.

- o Exceptions from two year requirement
 - *Active military/dependents
 - *Dependents of retired military who relocate to Missouri within one year of retirement
- o Exceptions must attend an A+ high school and meet all other requirements during the school year immediately preceding graduation

An overall attendance record will be kept from the beginning of the student's freshman year until graduation.

Attendance information is available in the A+ office or with the attendance secretary.

ATTENDANCE APPEAL PROCESS

A student/parent/guardian can appeal the student's attendance record with the A+ Coordinator. Anyone making an appeal should use the A+ Attendance Appeal Form available from the A+ Coordinator. Documentation relating specifically to the appealed absences should be included with the appeal form. (i.e. doctor's note must include a statement indicating specific condition or treatment). The A+ Coordinator will convene the Attendance Review committee when an attendance appeal is filed. An Attendance Review Committee will be composed of the A+ Coordinator, Upper School Principal, 12th Grade Bible Teacher and Lead Administrator. After the Attendance Review Committee reaches a decision, the A+ Coordinator will notify the

students and parents by letter. The decisions of the review committee will be considered final. All granted attendance waivers will be on record until the end of the senior year and manually recalculated.

ATTENDANCE WAIVER GUIDELINES

Anyone submitting a request for an A+ attendance waiver of days missed shall provide the A+ Coordinator with the following official documentation.

No student will receive a waiver if absences are due to any of the following:

Personal

- Personal/family vacation
- Suspension from school for any reason
- Transportation problems (unless inclement weather and approved by administrator)
- Truancy
- Skipping Classes

Attendance requirements for A+ are not to be confused with general attendance requirements as stated in the Clinton Christian Academy Student Handbook.

A+ CITIZENSHIP GUIDELINES

Participation in the A+ Program is an honor and a unique privilege for Clinton Christian Academy students. Students pursuing the A+ Scholarship must maintain a record of good citizenship and avoid the unlawful use of drugs/alcohol.

Certification of good citizenship will be based on the official discipline record maintained in the high school office. The High School Principal will assign consequences for infractions of the discipline code and those administrators are responsible for certifying the accuracy of the student's discipline record.

EXPECTATION

Clinton Christian Academy A+ participants are expected to be good citizens at school and in the community. At Clinton Christian Academy a good citizen:

- Maximizes his/her educational opportunity.
- Recognizes and accepts responsibility in and beyond the school environment.
- Sets a positive example for all to follow at school and in the community.

All participants begin their high school career with good citizen status—zero (0) points. The accumulation of twenty-four (24) points at any time during a student's enrollment at Clinton Christian Academy will result in the revocation of the participant's good citizen status and his/her removal from the A+ Program.

Each disciplinary referral will negatively affect good citizen status according to the chart below.

Students may, for good cause, appeal their dismissal. Appeals may be made to the A+ Citizenship Appeals Committee (A+ Coordinator, Upper School Principal, 12th Grade Bible Teacher and Lead Administrator) who will be the final authority.

UNLAWFUL USE OF DRUGS/ALCOHOL

An A+ student will not sell, possess, or use any controlled substance or drug paraphernalia as defined by law and stated in the Clinton Christian Academy Student Handbook. The use of prescription medicine is allowed under Board Policy. Students and parents are responsible for understanding and following those guidelines.

A+ CITIZENSHIP APPEAL PROCESS

Students and parents or guardians may appeal an A+ disciplinary decision using the following process:

- Students and parents/guardians will have 15 calendar days to appeal a
 decision that is made dealing with discipline using the <u>A+ Citizenship Appeal</u>
 Form available from the A+ Coordinator.
- The appeal must be made in writing through the A+ Coordinator.
- The A+ Coordinator will convene the A+ Citizenship Review Committee. The A+
 Coordinator, Upper School Principal, 12th Grade Bible Teacher and Lead
 Administrator will serve on the A+ Citizenship Review Committee. After the
 committee reaches a decision, the A+ Coordinator will notify the parents by
 letter. Decisions of the Review Committee will be considered final.

A+ TUTORING

In order to qualify for the A+ Scholarship, students are required to perform at least 50 hours of unpaid school-based tutoring/mentoring of younger students. The tutoring/mentoring activities must:

- Involve A+ students with students in lower grades in the district;
- Provide, as an ultimate goal, encouragement to students in lower grades to get "turned on" to school, stay in school, and strive for good grades;
- Be school-based or under the auspices of the school.
- Up to 25% may include job shadowing prior to graduation.

Students seeking the A+ Scholarship must meet the following qualifications prior to beginning a tutoring/mentoring experience:

- Have a 2.5 unweighted, cumulative grade point average, 95% attendance, good citizenship status, and a signed A+ Statement of Intent;
- Commit to 50 hours of service in mentoring/tutoring;
- Provide own transportation and waive school district liability.

POLICIES OF THE TUTORING PROGRAM

Tutoring/mentoring must be school sponsored. Any exceptions must be preapproved by the A+ Coordinator. A log of hours must be kept and submitted to the A+ office to receive credit for tutoring.

Students may enroll in a Tutor/Mentoring course to meet these requirements.

Tutoring/mentoring may be done during the school year or during summer school (when offered or pre-approved).

Failure to follow the Tutoring/Mentoring guidelines may result in disciplinary action, and/or dismissal from the A+ Program.

No financial compensation may be accepted for tutoring/mentoring activities.

REMINDERS:

- A+ students must be enrolled full-time in a program of study at a participating Missouri public community college or career/technical school.
- A+ students must maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA. If a student's cumulative GPA drops below 2.5 they would no longer be eligible to receive A+ funds until the overall GPA is 2.5 or higher.
- Students must apply for non-loan federal financial aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid each academic year.
- The A+ Scholarship must be used within four years (48 months) of high school graduation.
- If you fail to meet the renewal criteria, you will not be eligible to again receive the A+ award until the term after your school determines that the criteria have been met. Schools have different policies for how frequently they monitor satisfactory academic progress. You will need to check with your school to determine when your award might be reinstated.

Four Year Colleges with A+ SCHOLARSHIPS

You may still be able to use A+ to get money at your four-year school. A+ will never be extended to four-year colleges/universities, some of those schools are offering their own local financial aid programs for A+ certified graduates.

A+ students who transfer from community colleges have a higher rate of graduation from four-year colleges because they have already invested two years in their education; are more focused; have had the experience of competing for grades in a college classroom; have better refined study skills; are 2 years older; and are better adjusted to the college environment. A+ transfer students are desirable and several Missouri four-year schools are trying to attract these students.

Below are examples of 4-year schools which offer limited financial benefits for being A+ eligible. This list is subject to change.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT THE A+ PROGRAM

- 1. Is there any cost for participating in the A+ Program? No
- 2. <u>Does my child have to use A+ if he or she signs the A+ Agreement?</u> No. A+ is an option. If other forms of financial aid are available and the student doesn't wish to use A+ to attend college, he or she is under no obligation to do so.
- 3. Where do the A+ requirements come from? With the exception of "local deadlines" all A+ requirements are established by the state and found in the Missouri statutes.
- 4. <u>Is there any limit to the number of children in each family who may participate?</u>
 No.
- 5. Where does the money come from to pay for this program? The general revenues of the State of Missouri.
- 6. Historically, the A+ Scholarship has been the last program in the Department of Education to experience a funding cut, but there are no guarantees.—There is no way to guarantee this funding.
- 7. What about the tutoring requirements? Tutoring must be performed between the summer before the 9_m grade year through the end of the senior year.
- 8. What is the GPA requirement? Students must graduate with an overall unweighted GPA of 2.500 or higher. All grades starting in 9th grade contribute toward the final GPA. GPA cannot be rounded; so a 2.499 GPA is not 2.500 for A+ purposes. Students cannot be removed from the program because the GPA falls below the GPA requirement; but, for every "bad" grade semester, it takes 3 semesters to recover.
- 9. <u>How many students may be certified A+ graduates for each class?</u> There is not a limit.
- 10. Are there any 4 year A+ colleges? No. However, several of the 4 year colleges in Missouri offer institutional scholarships to students who are certified as A+ graduates.
- 11. How many high schools are A+? There are around 618 high schools in Missouri and 274 of them are A+ schools. Most Missouri graduates don't have access to the A+ benefit.
- 12. Where is the A+ Coordinators office located? CCA administrative office.

Students must make a good faith effort to secure all available federal financial aid by completing the **FAFSA prior to April 15** of the graduating year. Qualification for student aid does NOT affect qualification for the A+ Scholarship. The FAFSA can be completed online utilizing the web address listed above. To complete this process, you will need all current W2 forms and related tax information OR a completed tax return.

Further, to maintain eligibility after graduation, I understand that I must accomplish the following:

- 1. Attend on a full time basis at a Missouri public community college, vocational/technical school, or private two-year vocational/technical school.
- 2. Achieve at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale by the end of the initial fall semester. Students must improve this to at least a 2.5 GPA by the spring semester and maintain satisfactory academic progress thereafter.
- 3. Complete 12 credit hours each term in which you receive an A+ award.

This agreement only signifies that it is my intent to meet or exceed the above noted eligibility criteria that will allow me to participate in the A+ Scholarship Program.
