Clinton Christian Academy Board Notes

December 8, 2025

The CCA Board of Directors met in the CCA Art Room for their regular monthly business meeting on Monday, December 8. The meeting began with the opening prayer given by Barry Bullock. Board member David Mills shared a devotion based on Luke 5:1–11, reflecting on the fishermen's daily task of mending their nets—a routine, often mundane, yet essential responsibility. David noted that Jesus may have been drawn to fishermen as disciples because of the patience and faithfulness required to perform such ordinary work. In the same way, board members are called to "tend our nets" as we care for the needs of staff, students, and the school's resources. This passage reminds us that even Jesus valued the importance of everyday tasks, and that we are called to approach them with joyful and faithful hearts.

The financial reports and bills from the month of November were reviewed and approved. Prayer requests were shared.

- Mrs. Ritchie reported that the enrollment during the first semester has remained steady. One new student has been enrolled at grade 8 since the last meeting. Another family with students at K4 and K5 toured, are moving to Clinton over Christmas break, have enrolled, and will begin attending on Jan. 5. This brings our enrollment to 181 as we begin second semester.
- Mrs. Hyke shared the fall Boys' Soccer update from Coach JD Manning: Team Award Winners: MVP: Collin Higgins; Patriot Award: Colten Manning; Defensive Player of the Year: Parker Lowe; and Most Improved: Isaac Curnutte. Team record for Varsity was 18-1 overall. The varsity team won 1st place in the MoKan regular and conference. The team was runner up at state. The JH soccer team had a 1-7 record.
- The administration updated the board concerning the school-wide Christmas Service Projects. CCA families and staff collected 171 pudding/jello boxes for Operation Christmas Cheer food baskets distributed by the Samaritan Center and 58 Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes. High School Students from CCA volunteered all day on Mon., Nov. 17, to help load shoeboxes onto the semi-trucks.

- > The 2026 Senior Trip will be traveling to Flagstaff, Arizona and the Grand Canyon. Pray for our seniors as they will be doing ministry in Kansas City and Flagstaff. They will take the Amtrak from Kansas City to Flagstaff, Arizona. The Senior trip is scheduled for the last week in April.
- > The Board discussed and approved the salary increase and tuition amounts for the 2026-27 school year. This information will be shared with families at the January 27 Re-enrollment Meeting.
- The administration shared a mid-year staffing review with the Board of Directors. This agenda item provides an opportunity for administrators and Board members to share any information, concerns or questions they may have regarding staff employed this school year. CCA is blessed to have such a dedicated staff that sacrifices so much to minister at CCA!
- ➤ Jeff Lowe shared an update on the progress of the Capital Campaign Committee. Committee members have been conducting one-on-one visits since last January with CCA partners and have secured generous commitments toward the \$4+ million goal for facility enhancements. The committee is entering the final phase of securing donations and are preparing to open the campaign to the broader community, with specific details and opportunities to support the initiative to be shared at the Re-enrollment Meeting on January 27.
