Clinton Christian Academy Board Notes

January 12, 2026

The CCA Board of Directors met in the CCA Art Room for their regular monthly business meeting on Monday, January 12. The meeting began with the opening prayer given by David Mills. Barry Bullock shared a brief devotion from Luke 18:35–43, reflecting on the healing of the blind beggar. The message emphasized that Christ shows no partiality and responds to those who recognize their need and call on Him in faith. Despite pressure from the crowd, the blind man humbly and persistently cried out to Jesus, demonstrating active faith. His faith brought immediate healing, and his gratitude and testimony of God’s goodness became a witness that positively influenced others. As sinners, we can follow this same example by humbly acknowledging our need, persistently calling on the Lord, and faithfully trusting Him to bring spiritual wholeness.

The financial reports and bills from the month of December were reviewed and approved. Prayer requests were shared.

- Mrs. Ritchie CCA was pleased to report that CCA was awarded a \$35,000 Skidmore Grant. Checks were presented to grant recipients by Kyle Sisney during Christmas break, and CCA was honored to participate in the presentation, which was also featured in the *Daily Democrat*. CCA requested grant funds to support a variety of instructional and operational needs, including part-time IT support, classroom technology, computer and lab supplies, academic curricula, math resources, stage risers, and a RightNow Media subscription—enhancing both learning and school operations across multiple programs.
- Mrs. Ritchie reported that CCA’s annual Round Up for students entering preschool and kindergarten for the 2026–27 school year is scheduled for February 6. An article has been submitted to the local newspaper, and new promotional flyers have been posted. Families with eligible children are encouraged to help spread the word and share this information with others who may be interested.
- Jeff Lowe provided an update on the Capital Campaign Committee, noting strong progress toward the \$4+ million goal for facility enhancements. Since last January, committee members have conducted one-on-one visits with CCA partners and secured generous commitments. The campaign will soon enter its final phase, expanding outreach to the broader community. **Additional details and ways to support the campaign will be shared at the Re-enrollment Meeting on January 27 at 6:00 p.m. in the CCA gym.**

BOARD ACTION & DISCUSSION IN JAN.

- The Board approved a resolution authorizing the Board President to determine and approve the fund designation of all Capital Campaign funds, including the allocation of such funds to specific capital projects, reserves, and board-approved capital purposes.
- The Board authorized Elroy Schumacher (Controller), Barry Bullock, and Melanie Dehn to disburse Capital Campaign funds designated for facility enhancements, as needed, to pay vendors for building improvements.
- The Board approved authorization for architect Chris Ball to begin work on detailed building specifications for CCA facility improvements, based on designs previously approved by the Board
- The Board approved a policy that clearly outlines the four tuition discounts currently available—multi-child, ministry, employee and paid-in-full. This policy helps ensure transparency and consistency, making it easier for families to understand and access the discounts for which they qualify.
