Clinton Christian Academy Board Notes

February 9, 2026

The CCA Board of Directors met in the CCA Art Room for their regular monthly business meeting on Monday, January 12. The meeting began with the opening prayer given by David Mills. Debbie Glasscock gave the devotion focused on Psalm 46, especially verse 10, reminding us that God is our refuge and strength. She shared the Hebrew word *Machseh*, describing God as a place of safety and hope—our refuge where we are secure with Him. She also discussed the meaning of *Yashiwa*, pointing to God’s saving presence. Debbie encouraged us to open our hearts to others who may be hurting, remembering that God is our safe place who covers us and quiets the storms within. As we rest in Him, we are called to become a refuge for others by showing them Jesus.

The financial reports and bills from the month of January were reviewed and approved. Prayer requests were shared.

- Mrs. Ritchie reported that on January 22, Faida Abdrabou, Senior Review Specialist, conducted an on-site administrative review of Clinton Christian Academy’s Food Services program for USDA Free and Reduced Lunch Program compliance. No issues were found during the on-site review, and the desk review is ongoing, with final results to be shared in the coming weeks.
- Mrs. Ritchie reported that CCA’s annual Round Up for students entering preschool and kindergarten for the 2026–27 school year was held on Friday, Feb. 6. There were 11 students that were screened for next year’s K4 Preschool Program. We are excited as we begin planning for next year’s group!
- The Board completed a first reading of the proposed 2026-27 school calendar. Mrs. Ritchie presented two calendar options and shared feedback gathered from staff regarding each. The Board will conduct a second reading and vote for final approval at the March 9 meeting.
- Mrs. Ritchie reported that all 108 families have submitted intent forms for the 2026–27 school year. Of those, 101 families have indicated plans to return, one family has shared that they will not be returning, and six families remain undecided at this time.

BOARD DISCUSSION IN FEBRUARY

- Jeff Lowe reported that the public reveal of the CCA Capital Campaign on Jan. 22 was a wonderful success! Despite cold temperatures and snow, many parents, grandparents and CCA supporters gathered to hear about the future vision for our campus. We are currently in the midst of a capital campaign focused on enhancing our facilities to better support students, faculty, and programs, strengthening the learning environment and stewarding our campus for future generations. The Capital Campaign Committee continues reaching out to those who have a heart for Christian education as we make the final push to complete the campaign. Please continue to pray for the campaign and consider how God may be leading your family to support this important effort.
- The Board approved offering an additional 12 x 2 foot advertising banner space in the gymnasium for bid at this year’s auction. Interested vendors will have the opportunity to secure the space for a two-year term, with a minimum bid of \$2,500 per year.
- Mrs. Hyke reported that the Junior High Pizza Party & High School Planning Meeting is scheduled for Mar. 3 at 6:00 pm in the gym. Several high school students and parents will speak about what to expect in high school, including scheduling, course selection and available opportunities. Mrs. Schumpert will also present information about the A+ program and explain her role as guidance counselor in supporting high school students.
