March 9, 2026

The CCA Board of Directors met in the CCA Art Room for their regular monthly business meeting on Monday, March 9. The meeting began with the opening prayer given by Elroy Schumacher. Tiffany Thornton shared a devotion from **Psalm 24**, reflecting on a week she spent praying specifically for CCA during Global Prayer Day. She reminded the board that everything at CCA belongs to God and expressed gratitude for the strong foundation laid by the school’s founders. Tiffany emphasized trusting the Lord to direct CCA’s steps, teaching students not just behavior but to truly seek God, and keeping our hearts undivided before Him. She also encouraged continued prayer for CCA’s leaders, asking that the **King of Glory** would enter and permeate the school so that every student who passes through CCA would be changed and prepared to impact the world for Christ!

The financial reports and bills from the month of February were reviewed and approved. Prayer requests were shared.

- Emily Stocking, Auction Chair, shared the following update regarding the CCA Auction held on Feb. 21: The 2026 CCA Auction has successfully concluded! Despite the challenges of changing the format, the Lord provided, and everyone adapted wonderfully. Dinner was delicious, the student performances were delightful, and early number show the new live-item format did not impact income. Even better, we’ve already reached our matching funds goal! The Auction Leadership team met on Feb 9 to review lessons learned and begin planning for the 2027 auction.
- Mrs. Hyke reported that the Junior High Parent/Student Pizza Party focusing upon Planning for High School occurred on Tues., March 3 with 14 families (approximately 50 individuals) in attendance. Katie Largent and Hadley Hyke, CCA Sophomores, spoke to those in attendance sharing their favorite CCA memory, advice for prospective high school students, and their high school experience. Jeff Lowe gave a devotion which focused upon building deep roots with Jesus Christ as the foundation for success. Mrs. Hyke and Mrs. Schumpert shared information about high school schedules, course options, the four year plan, and A+ Scholarship.

BOARD ACTION & DISCUSSION IN MARCH

- Two proposed calendars (Draft A & Draft B) for the 2026-27 school year were presented to the Board for consideration, along with the results of a staff poll. The Board approved Draft B, which sets the first day of school for students on August 24 and the last day of school on May 21.
- The Board reviewed and approved contracts and at-will agreements for the 2026-27 school year.
- Mrs. Ritchie presented two revised policies to the Board for a first reading. Revisions to the Procurement Policy and Wellness Policy were required based on recommendations from the DESE Food Service Review conducted on January 22. The Board will conduct a second reading and consider final approval at the April meeting.
- Jeff Lowe and Elroy Schumacher provided an update on the Capital Campaign progress since its public reveal in January. Campaign Committee members are continuing individual visits, seeking pledges from businesses, friends, staff and families who wish to partner in this exciting facility enhancement project. Families and staff were recently informed about an opportunity to receive a limited-edition campaign pullover featuring the “Building Futures Together” logo. The committee’s goal is to have all pledge sheets submitted by March 31, though donations can be made anytime through the end of the calendar year.
