Clinton Christian Academy Board Notes

July 13, 2026

The CCA Board of Directors met in the CCA Art Room for their regular monthly business meeting on Monday, July 13. Tiffany shared a devotion centered on praying that Clinton Christian Academy would be a school set apart for God's purposes. She emphasized that being "set apart" is a foundational aspect of the Christian faith, calling believers to pursue holiness by living according to God's standards rather than embracing the values of the world. Drawing from I Peter 2:9, II Corinthians 6:17, Deuteronomy 14:2, and II Corinthians 5:20, Tiffany reminded the Board that Christians are God's chosen people and should reflect His character through a biblical worldview, godly fruit, and wholehearted devotion free from idols such as money or affluence. She noted that holiness is not legalism, but "love in action"—a joyful response to God's grace that flows from genuine heart change. She encouraged the Board to pray intentionally that CCA would continue to be a community distinctly marked by God's truth, love, and holiness.

The financial reports and bills from the month of June were reviewed and approved. Prayer requests were shared.

- Tentative enrollment for the 2026-27 school year is 160 students.
- Halie Spratley was hired at a Special Board meeting held on June 25. Halie attended the July 13 meeting to share her testimony and meet the Board. Halie graduated from Pensacola Christian College in May 2026 with a degree in Elementary Education. Halie lives in Warsaw and attends Faith Baptist Church in Sedalia. Halie has two older brothers. - Mrs. Ritchie provided an update on Food Services staffing for the 2026-27 school year. Jackie McClure will continue serving as both Food Services Director and Elementary PE Teacher. She will assist with food preparation on Mondays, while an additional employee will be hired to oversee meal preparation and service Tuesday through Friday. Liz Sanchez will also continue in her role as Food Services Assistant. Applications are currently being accepted for the Tuesday-Friday Food Services position.

BOARD ACTION & DISCUSSION IN JULY

- The Board met with Architect Chris Ball to discuss proposed value engineering options regarding the renovations to CCA. Information is continuing to be gathered so that the job can be awarded to a general contractor sometime soon. Please pray that God will grant wisdom to the Board as they make all the necessary decisions related to the facility enhancement project.
- The board approved the proposed revisions to the Student Handbook.
- Mrs. Hyke reported information gathered at the summer MOKAN and MCSAA meetings.
- Student Exit Surveys were reviewed and discussed.
- The CCA discipline policy was reviewed and discussed, particularly regarding students with chronic behavioral concerns. The Board and administration discussed the importance of maintaining a consistent, biblically based approach to discipline while providing appropriate support and intervention for students exhibiting ongoing behavioral challenges. Administration will gather and review discipline policies from other Christian schools to identify best practices, evaluate potential improvements to current procedures, and develop recommendations for strengthening accountability, parent communication, documentation, and intervention strategies.
