Clinton Christian Academy Board Notes

September 14, 2026

The CCA Board of Directors met in the CCA Art Room for their regular monthly business meeting on Monday, September 14. At last night's CCA Board meeting, Debbie Glascock shared a powerful devotion centered on Luke 23:34 and Matthew 6:14–15, drawing from her recent missions' trip to Nepal. Debbie shared about the ongoing persecution faced by Christians there, including the family with whom she and her team will be staying as they travel to Nepal for another missions' trip later this week who were recently forced from their home by their Hindu landlord. Despite persecution, loss, and even the recent devastating floods that claimed the lives of believers and damaged churches, missionaries in Nepal continue to press forward in faith. Debbie shared that they have encouraged others not to simply pray for persecution to end, but to recognize that God's power is often revealed most clearly through times of suffering. Her message challenged us to consider how blessed we are in the United States and to pray for our brothers and sisters around the world who faithfully serve Christ despite great hardship. Debbie also shared how much she has learned about discipleship from missionaries who continue to faithfully invest in others, reminding us all of the importance of following Christ's example of forgiveness, perseverance, and making disciples.

The financial reports and bills from the month of August were reviewed and approved. Prayer requests were shared.

- Current enrollment for the 2026-27 school year is 159 students. There are 15 families new to CCA this year.
- Mrs. Ritchie updated the board that CCA is excited to celebrate the beginning of our \$3.6 million capital project with a Groundbreaking Ceremony on Wednesday, September 30, at 9:30 a.m. The celebration will include special speakers, a song from the CCA Worship Team, and a special Senior Time Capsule. Final details are still being developed, with invitations being prepared for our CCA family, donors, community members, and Capital Campaign supporters. This will be a special opportunity to celebrate God's provision and His faithfulness as we look forward to the exciting future He has planned for Clinton Christian Academy. Please mark your calendars and plan to join us for this important milestone in CCA history!
- Mrs. Hyke reported that CCA students have access to additional educational opportunities, including Clinton Technical School, Work Experience, Launch, AP, and dual-credit courses. For dual-credit courses, families may choose from both secular and Christian colleges and universities. This is a family decision, and students are encouraged to discuss their options with their parents and CCA staff, seek wise counsel, and remain firmly grounded in God's Word. Mrs. Hyke also provided the Board with a letter that is used to communicate these options and considerations with high school students and their parents.

BOARD ACTION & DISCUSSION IN SEPTEMBER

- The Board approved increasing the mileage rate for staff to 72 cents per mile.
- The CCA Board approved moving forward with a new internet provider and transitioning from our current satellite service with Rocket Connect to fiber internet through Connexion Connect. Fiber will provide a faster, more reliable connection and is now available at CCA without the significant upfront installation costs previously associated with the service. CCA tech advisors from CISC have recommended the 1GB/1GB shared fiber option as a good fit for CCA's needs. This upgrade will help ensure that our students and staff have dependable internet access to support the school's growing technology needs. Special thanks to Mrs. Hyke for her research and help with CCA technology needs.
- A report from Klassen Construction Company was shared with the Board. The capital project is progressing on schedule, with the construction of the Science Lab/Basement Classrooms area moving into the beginning phases. Basement excavation is scheduled to begin September 23, followed by rebar, footings, foundation walls, waterproofing, drainage, and backfilling. Work will then move to the new Cafeteria/Commercial Kitchen area. Meanwhile, the construction and design teams continue addressing existing site utilities and reviewing project materials and submittals. Overall, the project continues to move forward with steady progress and careful preparation for the next stages of construction.
